Meet Aryanti, from Mekarsari, Indonesia. Through Mercy Corps' BENTANI program, she received training and support to start her own business, making and selling snack chips infused with local Indonesian flavors. With business skills, marketing support, and entrepreneurship sessions, she generated 400,000 IDR (268 USD) in just one month, allowing her to save for emergencies and her children's education. Aryanti's entrepreneurial spirit has even inspired her 15-year-old daughter to follow in her footsteps, selling the chips at school.

Meet Lilik from Sumber Mukur, Indonesia. After the devastating eruption of Mount Semeru in 2021, Lilik and her family were forced to relocate from their home village of Sumber Wuluh. When another eruption occurred in December 2022, they had to evacuate quickly, while holding her 2-year-old daughter, Belvia Lilik was only able to grab her diploma. Fortunately, Mercy Corps provided rapid support to Lilik's family, including clothing, household items, and essentials like a water dispenser and rice cooker.
